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

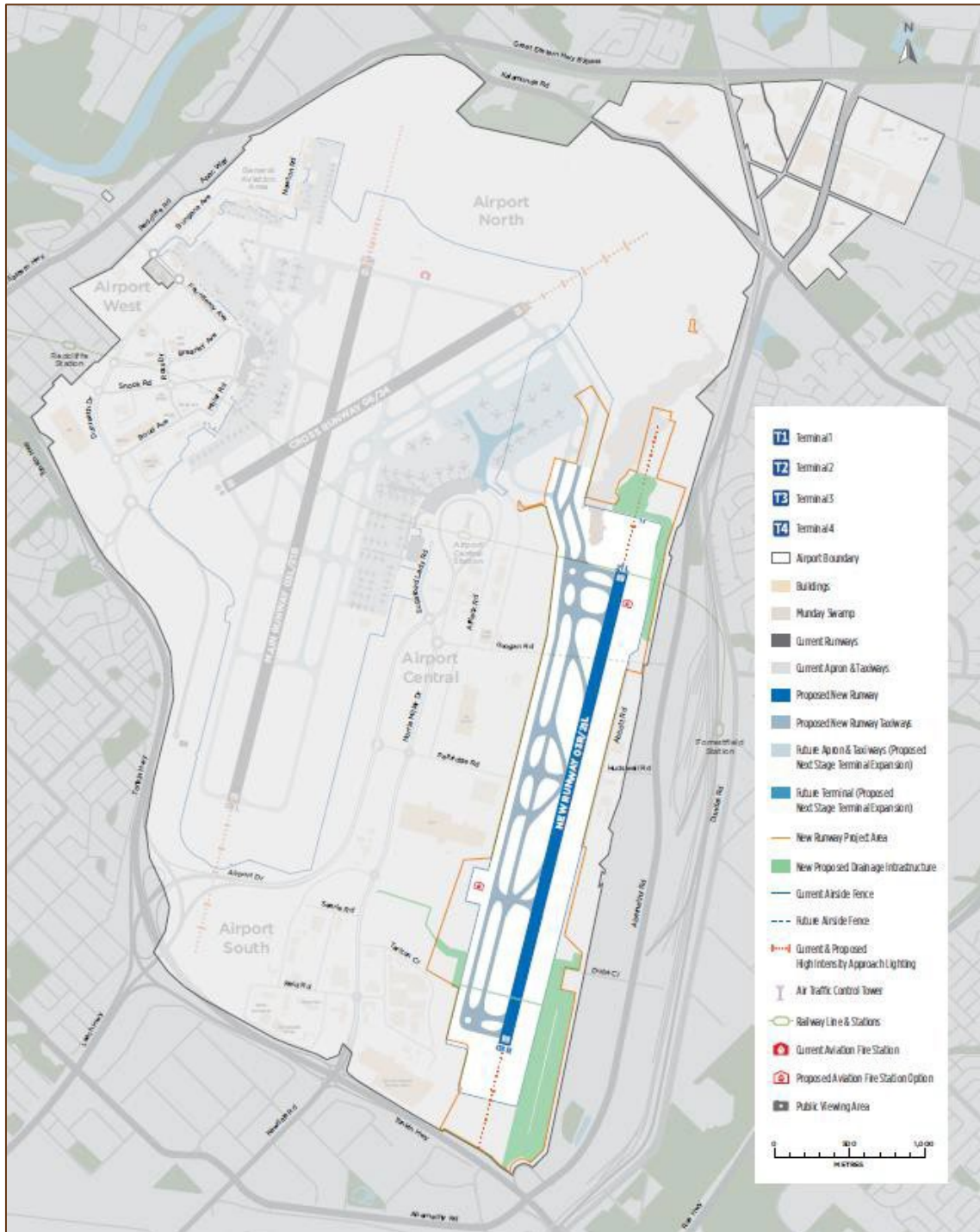


Figure 1-1: New Runway MDP Project (preliminary design)

### Part 13 Permit, Perth Airport New Runway Project [E2018-0147] – Condition 6

We refer to the permit issued to Perth Airport Pty Ltd (PAPL) on 29 July 2021 under Part 13 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (Cth) for the New Runway Project, as varied on 27 August 2021 (Permit).

In accordance with Condition 6 of the Permit, we write to inform the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (Department) that PAPL intends to meet its obligation to offset the loss of Banksia Woodlands of the Swan Coastal Plain (Banksia Woodlands) by undertaking Condition 5a of the Permit.

Condition 5a requires PAPL to 'acquire control of offset area(s) by 1 December 2023 which is a minimum of 236 hectares in size and meet the following criteria:

- i. meets the description of the Banksia Woodlands of the Swan Coastal Plain and the key diagnostic characteristics defined in the Approved Conservation Advice for the Banksia Woodlands of the Swan Coastal Plain ecological community; and
- ii. meets a minimum Habitat Quality Score of 5 out of 10 as determined by the Banksia Woodlands Habitat Quality Scoring Framework, with a minimum score of 60 for Vegetation Condition.

We trust that this letter satisfies PAPL's obligation under Condition 6 of the Permit to notify the Department of PAPL's decision to offset the loss of Banksia Woodlands in accordance with Condition 5a.
